Short summary of the project

The aim of the project is to organize networking events that provide opportunities for the broad involvement of local citizens in the dialogue about the European Green Deal and the future of Europe. Our main goal is to initiate discussions among citizens about sustainability, climate neutrality, the challenges of the transition, the background of the new EU growth strategy, and how these influence citizens' daily lives and local social processes.

The primary focus of the networking activities is the comparative analysis of how sustainability appears at the local level: what similarities and differences exist between participating countries, how much citizens engage with thinking about Europe's future at the local level, and what

opportunities exist for cross-border cooperation among citizens to strengthen sustainable towns and local communities.

In the first phase of the project, we conduct a complex survey among residents and decision-makers in the municipalities, with the aim of assessing citizens' general awareness and areas of interest in the topic, as well as collecting concrete experiences and good practices. Based on the results of the survey, we will organize 9 on-site thematic meetings (including a kick-off workshop) and 5 online events (including an interim progress review workshop). These events will explore issues of sustainability across several fields (economy, local society, education, energy management, transportation), involving broad social groups—particularly young people.

Research:

As a result of the project, a joint twin-city sustainability strategy will be created, defining the directions for future cooperation.
